Grand Master's Report

It is indeed an honour to be presenting my Grand Master's Report at these 160th Annual Sessions as well as the 100th Anniversary of Grand Lodge of the LOBA in Ontario.

I would like to thank you for attending these Sessions and to help guide and direct our Associations into the future. I would like to thank the Planning Committee for their tireless work in organizing these sessions. A big thank you goes to our sessions co-ordinator, R.W. Bro. Tom Wright. Anybody who does not take advantage of the package is missing out in the social aspect of the sessions, which I feel is just important as the meetings. That is when some of the best ideas come about.

This is the 18th time we have met in Peterborough, the first being the 4th Annual Session in 1863. Peterborough is known as the Gateway to the Kawarthas and for their lift lock which we see later this afternoon. Peterborough has also given us a number of great leaders and Orangemen, such as R.W. Bro. Morgan Brown, PPGM, R.W. Bro. Ralph Langley, PPGM, and R.W. Bro. Roy Best, PPGM, all of whom held the Orange Order in high regard.

Our Queen, her Majesty Elizabeth II, Queen of Canada, has continued to serve her people with grace and dignity. We congratulate her on the birth of another great grandchild, Archie. He is the son of Prince Harry, and is 7th in line to the throne. We wish The Queen good health as she continues her duties. God Save The Queen!

Over the last year we have lost a number a number of dedicated members of whom we never forget. We express our condolences to the families. Let us also remember all those first responders and the members of our military who put their lives on the line for us every day.

Over the last year I represented you at the Grand Lodge of Canada which was held in Fredericton, New Brunswick. I gave them a report from our sessions. I attempted to get to as many County meetings as possible to meet and talk to as many members as possible. The correspondence has been light with very few invitations to attend special functions. I did attend the reopening of Montague Orange Hall and the Testimonial Dinner for M.W. Bro. Don Wilson, GM of Canada.

When we left sessions we were sending letters to the major political parties asking specific questions - which was done. Only one party responded and they stated to go to their website. Disappointing.

I sent letters to Premier Doug Ford congratulating him on his election win. I also pointed out that perhaps it is time to have one school system in Ontario. Letters were also sent to Jody Wilson-Raybould, MP and Jane Philpott, MP, for standing up for their principles. A letter was also sent to Don Cherry asking to work together about getting pictures of The Queen in all arenas.

This year we will commemorate the 75th Anniversary of D-Day. We have saved a seat at the head table at the banquet for the soldier that did not make it home.

I wonder if R.W. Bro. M.W. Strange, Grand Master 1860, could have imagined at that first session in Kingston that in 2019 we would still be meeting for our 160th annual session. Since that time we have had the Confederation of Canada, two World Wars, and the Great Depression. We have gone from horse and buggy to automobiles and air flight as well putting men and women in space. Could that group of men at this first session have seen this, probably not, but the principles and morals they instilled are still just as viable today as they were then.

I have been attending these sessions since 1986 inclusive, this is my 34th session. I have met some great people that I will never forget such as M.W. Bro. Mac Storey, R.W. Bro. Sherman Irwin, and M.W. Sis. Carol Mitchell just to name a few. Their dedication to our association must never be forgotten. I also remember all the ideas that R.W. Bro. Keith McCooeye had and I still believe most of them are still viable. We must still move forward.

This past summer my family and I went on a trip to Scotland and Northern Ireland. I represented Ontario East by walking in Shotts, Scotland, with Hamilton District, and in Newtownards, Northern Ireland, with Conlig Village Star LOL. We were welcomed with open arms and had a wonderful time and made some friendships. It proves to me that Orangeism is worldwide. I spoke with the average members about what their issues are and they are not very different than ours. Education and Communication is the key.

The Future

If we are going to have a future we need to work on educating the public about who we are and what we stand for. This is going to cost money, and there is no point to have money if we do not have any members. I am suggesting that we put our money into promotion investments that hopefully will see returns. We are working on a new website and avenues to get people to the website, such as Facebook, Twitter, and other literature etc. We want to put up displays in malls and events across our jurisdiction. We are looking to have town hall meetings inviting the public with question and answer periods. We need to have children's activities or days with education and fun. As a Grand Lodge we need to communicate better with our members and need every member involved to keep our association alive.

There are potential members out there. We just need to find them. We are trying to put as many tools in the hands of the members to do that. The best way to get members is to talk about it and tell people who and what we stand for.

Session Minutes – Day 1 Friday, May 31st, 2019

Credential Committee

Grand Master's Address

The Grand Master's Address was delivered by R.W. Grand Master Richard Lowery. The report was received with many thanks by Motion #3, filed and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Grand Auditor's Report

The Grand Auditor's Report was delivered by Brian Anderson & Edgar Carman, received by motion #4, filed, and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

County Master's Reports

The County Master's reports were delivered by the appropriate representatives. Despite the difficulties faced, we continue to 'soldier on'. Verbal and hard copies of these reports were received by motion #5, filed, and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Correspondence

Correspondence was read by R.W. Brother R. Campbell. These items included a letter from the LOBA , letters in connection to 12th of July Celebrations from the County of Victoria-Durham Loyal Orange Lodge, and County of Toronto Loyal Orange Lodge, as well as the annual passwords of the Loyal Orange Association, and the Loyal Orange Young Britons Association. It was decided that the annual passwords would be dealt with under General Business.

Report from Ontario East Triangle Court

A report was read by Worshipful Brother Jack Chatten who outlined the year's progress, and plans for the future. R.W. Bro. Chad Switzer asked if there was any discussion on future expansion, to which Bro. Chatten responded, saying that expansion is a consideration for the near future. Bro. Bill Bradley commented that 'affordable housing is needed'.

Report from the Loyal Orange and True Blue Home

ADJOURNED FOR LUNCH

Session Minutes- Day Two Saturday, June 1st, 2019

Sessions were called to order and re-opened at 9:00 a.m. Scripture reading by Grand Chaplain, John Arksey, was taken from Psalm #1.

Worshipful Brothers Lloyd Wylie and Bob Prentice saluted the chair and were found fit to attend the second day of sessions.

Right Worshipful Grand Master, Richard Lowery announced that registration fees have been included in the registration package for sessions, and thanked those members who took advantage of the deal.

Grand Treasurer's Report

The Grand Treasurer's Report was delivered by R.W. Bro. Art Duncan, who stressed the importance of properly documenting and registering GICs in order to better avoid conflict in the future. The difficulty newly re-instituted Fraserville Loyal Orange Lodge #46 had in recovering past investments was provided as an example.

Motion #9 was made to accept the report and have it printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Committee Reports were then delivered in the following order:

Charitable Donations Report

The Charitable Donations Report was prepared by Brothers Edgar Carman and Terry Good. Recorded donations seemed low in comparison to previous years, but may have been skewed by errors in communication from the Provincial Grand Secretary.

The report was received by motion #10, placed on file, and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Committee on Resolutions

Resolutions were prepared and presented by R.W. Bro. Russell Staye and R.W. Bro. Wesley Warren. The report was received by motion #11, placed on file, and printed in the Report of Proceedings

After hearing the resolutions, R.W. Grand Master Richard Lowery added that our guest speaker, Minister of Labour Laurie Scott, prepared for her visit by discussing Orange history, heritage, and trivia with several members of Cabinet within Queens Park, late into the evening hours.

Notice of Motions

A report on Notice of Motions was presented by R.W. Bro. Chad Switzer, and R.W. Bro. David Lajeunesse. A standing-vote on decreasing capitation tax by \$2/member was conducted on the floor. The result of the vote was 16 – 16. R.W. Grand Master Richard Lowery noted that not every member had voted. A second vote was conducted, and the motion carried.

Property & Trust

The Property & Trust Report was prepared by R.W. Bro. Wayne Hodgson and R.W. Bro. Michael Stapleton. Returned information appeared somewhat scant, and it is hoped that the Provincial Grand Secretary will correct the delivery of the Property & Trust forms for the next year. The report was received by motion #13, placed on file, and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Bursary Committee

A report on the Post-Secondary Bursary offered by the PGLOE was presented by Bro. Bill Bradley who stated that there were no successful applicants in 2018. Bro. Bradley also mentioned that adjustments, such as changing the application deadline to December 31st, needed to be made. R.W. Bro. Calvin Yeo suggested establishing a committee to meet and discuss applicants. The report, along with Bro. Yeo's suggestion, was received through motion #14.

Returns Committee

The report of the Returns Committee was prepared by Brother Ron Thertell and R.W. Brother Chad Switzer. The report included a recommendation to establish a "Membership Officer" to handle returns exclusively. The report was received by motion #15, placed on file, and printed in the Report of Proceedings.

Questions were then posed to M.W. Grand Secretary John Chalmers about our national membership numbers. Bro. Chalmers explained that refining the data is a 'work in progress'. Like lower levels of the Organization, he too experiences difficulty in navigating membership return information that is incomplete and/or outdated. R.W. Grand Master Richard Lowery suggested that our national membership is approximately 1800, to which there was general agreement from those familiar with the data.

Correspondence Committee

The report of the Correspondence Committee was prepared and presented by Brother Don Guy and R.W. Brother Michael Stapleton, who mentioned that an adequate job was done by Provincial Grand Secretary, but also recommended improved tracking of *postal mail* received and *replied to*. This report was received by motion #16.

LOYBA

A report on the Loyal Orange Young Britons Association was prepared and presented by Bro. John Kight and R.W. Bro. John Arksey. The LOYBA are looking for increased representation and recognition. Bro. Bill Bradley discussed the social initiatives of the LOYBA. The report was received by motion #17.

It was at this point that the Provincial Grand Secretary asked County Masters to sign for the annual passwords before leaving for recess.

R.W. Bro. Art Duncan brought forward concerns about outdated by-laws, by-laws that are being violated, and the need for a committee to review, refine and resubmit proposed by-laws to be voted on at PGOLOE sessions in 2020. This was received by motion #19.

iii) Audit Committee

R.W. Bro. Calvin Yeo proposed an audit committee to meet with Primary Lodges to go over how to properly submit membership and financial reports.

R.W. Grand Master Richard Lowery discussed training sessions will be available for County Masters in the coming months.

iv) Canadian Flags

Bro. Lloyd Wylie encouraged members to approach their respective MPs and MPPs and obtain a new Canadian Flag to display proudly and promote our national identity.

Report of the Provincial Grand Secretary

Greetings Brethren All,

My first year as your Grand Secretary was one of challenge and change, and I would like to first and foremost thank R.W. Bro. Calvin Yeo for assisting me with the transition into office. Bro. Yeo's ten- plus years of service at the Provincial level were an asset to me as I became accustomed to role and responsibilities I held, and I sense his experience will be an asset for many within the Association for years to come.

Compiling, editing, and arranging the printing of The Annual Report of Proceedings was one of the many tasks I undertook as Grand Secretary. As our most consistent means of communication, the Annual Report is not just the record of a single weekend's event, but rather a reflection of the year as a whole, and as such, serves as an historical account, and a contemporary reflection on the state of the order. This past year's publication began with an attempt to update the cover by utilizing the logo developed by Bro. Dennis Glazier, a design that features a youthful King Billy bursting through a Maple Leaf, flanked by the Union Jack on his right, and the Canadian flag on is left. It is an image full of energy and enthusiasm, reminding us of the passion and fervor with which we should pursue the endeavours of the Order.

Preparing, managing, and processing the Annual Membership Returns of the primary, district, and county lodges is another essential responsibility of the Grand Secretary's office. A number of problems arose this past year in regard to those forms, mostly because outdated information remained where it should have been changed. Ultimately, problems such as these lead to engaged discussion with many members, and I am pleased to report that a clearer picture of our membership has emerged. At this point in time, we have approximately 275 "live bodies" in Eastern Ontario, but of that total approximately 55 hold dual memberships. These dual memberships inflate our numbers to approximately 330. Of the 275 names on record, far too many are not accompanied with information such as: date of initiation, degrees conferred, and offices held. Hopefully, this picture will become clearer in the year ahead.

To assist in the gathering and sharing of information, a website sponsored by the PGOLOE was developed over the past few months, and launched last night at our banquet. While the site remains a work in progress, the pieces are in place to establish a hub of communication for members, as well as the general public. Moreover, the platform allows us to present Eastern Ontario Orangeism as an identity that both counters and compliments the 'Torontification' promoted by contemporary literature and recent academic commentary. Through our Bursary Program, which will encourage applicants to conduct original research utilizing source material on the website, we look to engage and appeal to a new generation of Orangemen who recognize the cultural significance of the Association, and its necessity in the modern era.

My strong belief in the creation of a website designed and belonging to the PGOLOE was re-enforced several times throughout the past year, and perhaps best exemplified in correspondence I had with two individuals. The first was with Mr. Stephen Hill, the curator of the Haliburton Museum. I contacted Mr. Hill after reading an article he had written for the "Haliburton Echo"

in which he paid tribute to the social significance of the areas' local Orange lodges. Mr. Hill recognized the misconceptions that often pervade public perception of the Order, and admitted that in all his searching through primary Orange records, he had "yet to find anything scandalous or incriminating." A second item of correspondence I received came from Samuel Beckton, an MPhil student at Queen's University Belfast. Beckton was researching an endeavor in 1934 by 8 000 Protestants living in East Donegal who petitioned to be politically aligned and legally affiliated with Northern Ireland. Beckton was in search of a Canadian response, and in doing so, was following list of scholars and enthusiasts looking to research the social, cultural, political, and overarching historical impact of Orangeism in Canada.

By making our primary source material available to the public through the new website, it is hoped that a truer and more balanced perception of the Orange Association will prevail in succeeding generations.

In closing, this past year has been a valuable learning experience, and I appreciate the opportunity to serve the Association in such an important capacity. While the past year was not without faults, it was also not without gains, and with the foundation laid this past year, it is hoped that growth will soon prevail.

1) Bank Accounts

We have two bank accounts. Our trust account had \$ 8,557 and our chequing account had \$ 15,166.

2) Investment Report

The Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario East have invested the funds under our jurisdiction with two agencies. The first agency is Ridgewood Capital Asset Management. We have invested \$166,210 in the equity market. Our earning received in 2018 were \$ 6,027. The second agency is Select Wealth Management Ltd. This is where we have invested are guaranteed investment certificates with different financial institutions. The investment with guaranteed investment certificates amounts to \$ 74,594 which has yielded \$ 1,475. The only other investment we have is with LOL 405 Kendal in the amount of \$ 15,000. These investments total \$ 255,804.

3) Primary Trust Investments and Liabilities

We have under our custody Primary investments that total \$ 171,286. These are invested with Ridgewood Capital Asset Management and Select Wealth Management Ltd, which handle the guaranteed investment certificates. The interest earned of \$ 4,429 on these investments were disbursed out to the Primary Lodge that owns the funds. The Primary Trust liabilities are listed separately and come to a total of \$ 179,668.

4) Receipts

Capitation tax of \$ 9,652 was collected in the current year and Renfrew County and LOYBA Vimy Ridge has not paid their current capitation taxes. Miscellaneous income was \$ 450.; of which \$ 425 was the Church Service and \$ 25 was a donation to the Provincial Lodge.

5) Expenses

In the expenses we are over budget on two lines. Fraternal visits and committee meeting costs.

Net Income (loss)

We have a loss this past year of \$ 5,516, which is under the forecast budget of \$ 23,542 deficit.

We your auditors would like to state that it is not our intention and or function to point out any criticism on any financial or executive officers. Our only capacity is to offer recommendations on nay financial findings.

We conducted a review of all the records and files provided by the Grand Treasurer. These records include the receipts and expenditures for the calendar year ending December 31, 2018 along with comparative balance sheet and comparative income statement. We were provided a hard copy binder of all information – this information was well organized and easy to follow.

This review checks the records and ensures that all financial transactions have been properly recorded along with the overall financial position of this Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario East.

We also reviewed the statements from the Bank of Montreal Trust account and the Bank of Montreal General account, along with investment accounts and primary trust liabilities. In doing this review we were able to trace and compare interest payments to the corresponding primary lodges.

It would appear the Provincial Grand Orange Lodge of Ontario East continues another healthy year in regards to financial and investment matters, and maintained a lower than budget deficit.

In regards to how we reviewed the expense vouchers – we would randomly select an amount from the Income Statement and then work back to confirm voucher confirmation, cheque identification, dates signatures and brief explanations and then compare to bank statements.

Recommendation regarding vouchers – no major discretions were noted, however we would suggest that it would e everyone's best interest to ensure all pertinent information is included on vouchers, including dates, signatures, brief descriptions, mileage, etc. are filled out an presented to the Treasurer until mid-year. Not only is the information useful for the auditing process, it is also viewed y the entire membership.

In any instances that we had inquiries the Grand Treasurer was able to answer our questions. We would again like to acknowledge the major contribution and dedication of his time and service. NO major issues were found during this audit.

Again, we would like to mention the importance of communication, provision and discussion on all major items of information to all members, at every level.

With the information provided I can make the following report.

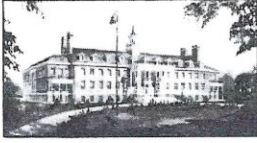
- We have 13 lodge halls owned by the organization

Report Bursary Committee

Dear Sirs and Brothers:

As chairperson of this committee I would like to report as follows:

We had one application this year for the bursary. Ultimately, that person left university in January, 2019 and thus the application was rejected. He did attend 1/2 of his second year and informed us he plans to return this fall and would be resubmitting his application.

The majority of the committee discussions were done by email.

We did meet briefly at the 12th of July and again at RW Bro Donald Wilson's testimonial dinner in the fall. Firstly, it became clear that the actual application made available to the lodges had not been updated to include the missing items pointed out at grand lodge last April.

Secondly, it was discovered that the September deadline was not achievable by university students as they were unable to obtain their marks and new course sheet in time.

At our meeting in the fall it was discussed, and approved with the Grand, Master that the deadline be changed to December 31st, and that any winner would be announced at Grand lodge, and if possible that the award handed out at the banquet at Grand Lodge.

During our review of the one application received, it became apparent that there were some differences of opinion as to the purpose of the bursary. The original bursary (see last year's report) was to be made available to any lodge member or any member of their family. Discussions at the committee level questioned this purpose and some felt there were other or better purposes that the bursary be used for.

It is the recommendation that this grand lodge set up a separate committee from the members currently on this committee to look into whether the rules need to be changed or expanded.

The original bursary was submitted and ultimately passed by way of a notice of motion.

Part of the recommendation to this Grand Lodge is whether this new committee need to bring in a new notice of motion or just bring new rules changes or expanded items to Grand Lodge next year.

For the 2019 / 2020 year it is recommended that the existing committee be kept in place in case there are any applications in the new-year.

- 2) You will submit a letter from your or a family member's lodge supporting your application, signed and sealed by the Worshipful Master. Items of support will be: lodge attendance, participation in the lodge, community and church.
- 3) You will submit a one page essay explaining why you are/are not a member of the Orange Association and changes you would like to see that might encourage you to join the lodge.
- 4) You will submit a copy of proof of registration and attendance
- 5) You will submit a current copy of your transcript on school letter head.

Note

- 1) The decision of the bursary committee shall be final. Successful candidates will be notified by mail.
- 2) A cheque will be forwarded following notification
- 3) The amount of bursary and number of bursaries granted may vary annually
- 4) Incomplete applications will not be considered by the Bursary Committee

Returns Committee Report

A large amount of data was received by the Committee from the Grand Secretary – many thanks are forwarded to him for the compilation of all of this data from Returns received for 2018. A summary of this data is as follows:

Number of Counties	- 7

Number of Lodges	- 35 (including newly reinstated Fraserville L.O.L. 46)
Number of Members	- 275
Number of Dual Members	- 40 (most of two Lodges but some are as many as 5 or 6)

As our numbers continue to decline, it becomes more important to know where our membership is located and consider how we can overcome this decline.

There seems to be continued difficulty getting the complete and, possibly, correct information on the Returns. For example, over half of the members listed do not have the areas of the degrees and offices checked, and most importantly, the date of initiation into the Orange Order. This is easy information to obtain and important to see how our Order is progressing.

With this in mind, it is recommended that we establish a Membership Officer for the purpose of detailed receipt, review and update of Annual Returns for the upcoming year, and thereafter as need be. This person would be appointed through the Grand Secretary to work with him in obtaining all the information required on the Returns. This would not be an elected or Executive position. In conjunction with the Grand Secretary, this person would establish timelines for the Returns – send out with Annual Report by September 30, Lodge R.S./Master to complete and submit to District Lodge by January 15, District Lodge to County Lodge by February 1, County Lodge to Grand Lodge by Feb 15 of each year. Consideration could also be given through this Grand Lodge to beginning the process for revision (through Grand Orange Lodge of Canada) of Constitution Rule No. 124 to provide more detail as per more specific dates regarding Returns.

All Returns would be reviewed to complete the required information, or contact is made to appropriate Lodge Secretary/Master by the Membership Officer to get proper/complete information. The Master Record System would then be brought up to date to provide the Returns in 2020. Any unresolvable issues would be brought to the attention of Grand Secretary as they occur.

For each year, the Membership Officer, in conjunction with the Grand Secretary, will provide an Annual Report at Grand Lodge Sessions listing Lodges, Districts and Counties that will include the number of regular members as well as any dual members in each.

I would like to submit this Report on behalf of the members of the Returns Committee for Sessions 2019 and would make a motion as such to also proceed with the recommendation included within.
